Operations Manager Report May, 2015

Meters -47 out of the planned 61 installs have been completed. All setters and new vaults for this year have been installed with the exception of the OCEC project at the entrance. For this project the OCEC seems to not know what it is doing and B&B won't communicate.

The leak detection survey was completed over a two day period. The acoustic devices can only listen 100 feet out from a valve or water service which is very limiting in our system and pvc pipe is the worst transmitter of sound. No major leaks were found but several minor ones were. Only one was on Edelweiss line. None require immediate action.

New PRV on QA – Work has started.

Eagles nest waterline – Work has started. I have decided to install listening posts for leak detection every 200 feet.

The glass in the sod hut door was cracked over the Memorial Day weekend. The campground people had stolen all 20 rolls of toilet paper by Saturday afternoon. They take them to their trailers. When others came to use the bathroom and found no tp they grabbed the paper towels which clogs the toilets and does not decompose in the septic tank. Usual campground behavior.

There was some fear that the first time the owner of the new house on Trillium came down his snow-covered driveway he would launch himself towards Larry Goldie's kitchen. I have placed three large anti-terrorism boulders for protection.
